

The Notice published in the *London Gazette* dated 24th October 1969 is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

In relation to meat and casings, recognition is restricted to those Certificates which are completed by the insertion of one of the following establishment numbers:

In relation to meat products (including canned meat), recognition is restricted to those Certificates which are completed by the insertion of one of the following establishment numbers:

In relation to meat products (excluding canned meat), recognition is restricted to those Certificates which are completed by the insertion of one of the following establishment numbers:

In relation to casings only, recognition is extended to include those Certificates which are completed by the insertion of one of the following establishment numbers:

THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS, 1968

Denmark: Official Certificate

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food Regulations 1968 he hereby varies the recognition of the Official Certificates reproduced in Part I of the Schedule to the Notice published in the *London Gazette* dated 23rd January 1969, for the importation of meat and meat products from Denmark, by extending that recognition to include meat of the description given in the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

PART I

Recognition of the Official Certificate is extended to include minced or chopped meat other than liver (with or without the addition of any spices, cereal products, salt, flavouring, vegetables or other ingredient), from specified establishment only.

Recognition is restricted to those Certificates which are completed by the insertion of the following establishment number:

CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT, 1952

To: v.LIND & CO., Hohe Bleichen 22, Hamburg 36, West Germany.

6th March 1970.

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952, and paragraph 1 of the 7th schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely a total of 1,904 cartons of tinned blackcurrants and 5 tins of such blackcurrants imported by John Rowlett & Company Limited of 38 Eastcheap, London E.C.3, and which are detailed in the Schedule hereto have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that the said goods were imported contrary to the prohibition contained in the Import of Goods (Control) Order 1954. Whereby and by force of section 44 (b) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952, the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a Solicitor in England who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf, in default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT, 1952

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952, and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely 400 cartons of solid pack blackcurrants imported by Kamstra Produce Ltd. at Hull on or about 22nd August 1969 under the reference Hull 7832/22.8.69 have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that (1) the said goods were imported contrary to the prohibition for the time being in force with respect thereto by virtue of the Import of Goods (Control) Order 1954 made under the Import Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act 1939, and (2) on 25th September 1969 an officer of Customs and Excise required the said Kamstra Produce Ltd.
