Direction Restricting Permitted Development at Fleggburgh

Notice is hereby given in accordance with paragraph (3) of Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning (General Development) Order, 1963, that the Minister of Housing and Local Government in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Article 4 of the said Order has approved a Direction made by the Norfolk County Council on 16th October 1968, relating to the following piece of land at Fleggburgh:—

Approximately 272 acres of land forming the whole or parts of O.S. Parcel Nos. <i>Class Removed</i>	<i>Description</i>
IV(2)	The use of the said land for the purpose of camping and the erection or placing thereon of movable structures for the purpose of such use.
V	The use of the said land other than buildings and not within the curtilage of a dwellinghouse, for the purposes of recreation or instruction by members of an organisation which holds a certificate of exemption granted by the Minister of Health under section 269 of the Public Health Act, 1936, and the erection or placing of tents on the land for the purposes of that use.
XXII	The use of the said land, other than a building, as a caravan site in any of the circumstances specified in paragraphs 2-9 (inclusive) of Schedule 1 to the Caravan Sites and Control of Development Act, 1960, or in the circumstances (other than those relating to winter quarters) specified in paragraph 10 of the said schedule:

With effect from the date hereof, no development of the class referred to above can be undertaken without specific planning permission.

Peak Park Planning Board (Cheadle Rural District) Public Path Diversion Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that on 27th February 1970, the Peak Park Planning Board confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert approximately 90 yards of footpath No. 103 on the west side of Waterfall Lane, Waterhouses to a line running from a point on the existing footpath approximately 160 yards north-west of its junction with Waterfall Lane, thence running south-east for 83 yards and thence south-west for 37 yards to rejoin the existing footpath at a point approximately 70 yards north-west of its junction with Waterfall Lane.

Shepshed Urban District Council Diversion of Footpath Order No. 1 1970
