THE OPENCAST COAL ACT 1958

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Technology, in exercise of the power conferred upon him by section 1 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958 granted on the 24th February 1970 to the National Coal Board an authorisation entitled *The Rhymney Authorisation 1970*, to work coal by opencast operations or cause or permit coal to be worked by opencast operations.

The land comprised in the authorisation is described in the Schedule hereto.

A copy of the authorisation and of the map referred to therein can be inspected at the offices of the Opencast Executive, National Coal Board, Cambrian Buildings, Mount Stuart Square, Cardiff, and at the offices of the Rhymney Urban District Council, Rhymney, Monmouthshire, and at the offices of the Tredegar Urban District Council, Bedwelty House, Tredegar, Monmouthshire, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on weekdays, Monday to Friday inclusive, with the exception of Good Friday, 27th March 1970, Easter Monday, 30th March 1970, and Easter Tuesday, 31st March 1970.

The authorisation becomes operative on the date on which this notice is first published in a local newspaper, or the date on which it is first published in the *London Gazette*, whichever is the later date, but if any person aggrieved by the authorisation desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that the authorisation is not empowered to be granted under the above-mentioned Act, or desires to question the validity thereof on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the authorisation, he may within 6 weeks from the date on which the authorisation becomes operative make application to the High Court under paragraph 15 of the First Schedule to the Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) Act 1946, as applied by paragraph 9 of the First Schedule to the Opencast Coal Act 1958.

SCHEDULE

The land comprised in the authorisation is situated partly in the Parishes of Rhymney and Llechryd in the Urban District of Rhymney and partly in the Parish and Urban District of Tredegar and wholly in the County of Monmouthshire. The site lies on the north-west face of Bryn-oeer Mountain to the south of Princetown and approximately 1½ miles north-east of Rhymney. The Ordnance Survey Sheets Scale, 1/2500th for the area are those numbered SO.1108, SO.1109 (1961 Edition), SO.1110 (1965 Edition) and SO.1209 (1960 Edition).

Public Path Diversion Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 18th day of February 1970, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation, or to be confirmed by the Basford Rural District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert the public right of way known as the "Tunnels" from a point 13 yards to the north of the mineral railway proceeding in a southerly direction over the mineral railway by the existing bridge to a point 60 yards south of the mineral railway; to a line commencing at a point 13 yards to the north of the mineral railway proceeding in a westerly direction for 27 yards and then in a southerly direction for a distance of 48 yards crossing the mineral railway at a point 28 yards west of the existing bridge and terminating at a point 45 yards south of the mineral railway.
