Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st April, 1971, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Ripley, Derby, at all reasonable times during the period of 7 weeks from the 13th March 1970.

Notice is hereby given that the County Borough of West Bromwich in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956, on the 2nd March 1970, made an Order entitled the County Borough of West Bromwich Smoke Control Order Number 19, 1970, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10, unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st October 1971, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

A copy of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected, free of charge, at the Town Hall, West Bromwich, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 13th March 1970.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.
