1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in Pilton Parish Churchyard, in the County of Somerset, shown broadly hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

#### Provided that-

- (a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stone-work or brickwork properly cemented;
- (b) In any, earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the
