Royal Highness Prince William of Gloucester while absent from the United Kingdom:

And whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in St. Mary's Churchyard, in the Parish of Wilsford, Grantham, in the County of Lincoln, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 19th day of December 1969, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, and in exercise of the powers conferred on Her Majesty by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 c. 134, and of all other powers in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Mary's Churchyard, in the said Parish, as shown broadly hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Mary's Churchyard, Wilsford, Grantham, Lincolnshire) Order 1970.
