

ABERCARN URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Factory Approach Road, Cwmcarn in the County of Monmouth

Notice is hereby given that on Thursday, the 21st May 1970, application will be made to Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of Monmouth assembled at the Magistrates' Court, Abercarn, in the said County of Monmouth, at 10.30 o'clock in the forenoon, for an Order authorising the diversion of parts of the road known as Factory Approach Road, Cwmcarn in the said County as follows:

1. That length of road which extends from the western end of Brierley Place, Cwmcarn, for a distance of 30 yards approximately in a north-westerly direction to a point where this road will be severed by the construction of the new road.
2. That length of road which extends from a point 40 yards approximately from the eastern end of Chapel Farm Terrace in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 20 yards to a point where this road will be severed by the construction of the new road.
3. Approximately 24 yards of the present road will be taken for the construction of the new road.

The road will be replaced by provision of a new length of road from the western end of Brierley Place, Cwmcarn, via staggered junctions off the new Canal Road to the entrance of Chapel Farm Terrace, Cwmcarn.

This application will be made under section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, on the grounds that it is necessary to divert the said portion of highway in view of the construction of a major road along the length of the former Monmouthshire Canal.

A plan showing the effect of the Order applied for is deposited at the Council Offices, Abercarn, and will be available for inspection during normal office hours.

Public Footpath No. 6 (Diversion) Order, 1970

Notice is hereby given that on 6th April 1970, the Dronfield Urban District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running diagonally across field Nos. 9400 and 0006 at Dronfield Woodhouse to a line running around the boundaries of those fields.
