L tin Speech : from thence they were conducted to their Devotions before the Image of that Convent : the King afterwards attended the Empreis to her Chamber , where the publick Ministers and Senators, were admitted to kils the nands of the Empreis, Queen, and Arch-Dutcheis. . After this the King seried to his own Apartment, where he gave Audience to the Gount Montecuculi the Emperors Plenipotentiaty The fame Evening the King supped publickly with tie Empreis, and Queen, and Arch-Dutcheis, and the next day-the Marriage was folemnly performed by the Popes Nuncio ; which ended san Excellent Entertain ment was prepared in the great Elah, where the King took his eat at the upper end , under a Canopy of State, with the Emprels, Queen, Arch-Dutchels, and Nuncio, other Tables being on the fides of the Hall prepared for the Entertainment of the Senators, and perfons of Greatest Eminency ; this Entertainment continued till 11 at night : after which, the reft of the time till 2 in the morning, was spent In Dancing.

This morning the two Courts parted, the King and Queen conducting the Empress and Arch-Dutchess, a mile on their way, and the same day took their way towads Warfaw The King intending to morrow, to take Post to be present at the Opening of the Assembly the 5th inttant.
