NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1968,
SECTION 94

The Birmingham (Leach Green Lane) Public Path (Diversion) Order 1970

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 9th day of June 1970 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Birmingham City Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert the public right-of-way running from a point on the western side of Leach Green Lane, Rednal in the City of Birmingham, about 450 feet south of the junction of Leach Green Lane and Bristol Road South to a point approximately 190 feet in a westerly direction therefrom to a position from a point on the western side of Leach Green Lane aforesaid and running therefrom in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 150 feet or thereabouts crossing the public right-of-way referred to above then continuing northwards for a distance of 70 feet or thereabouts again crossing the said right-of-way and then continuing in a westerly direction for a distance of 50 feet or thereabouts.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Town Clerk's Department, the Council House, Birmingham 1, and may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Department between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday in any week not later than the 22nd day of July 1970.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned at the Council House, Birmingham 1, not later than the 22nd day of July 1970, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Birmingham City Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Minister of Housing and Local Government

for confirmation themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Minister for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Minister with the Order.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1968, SECTION 94

The Huntingdon and Peterborough County Council (Somersham-Footpath No. 1) Public Path Stopping-Up Order No. 4, 1970.

Notice is hereby given that on 16th June 1970 the Huntingdon and Peterborough County Council confirmed the above-mentioned Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish the public right of way at Somersham in the Rural District of St. Ives in the County of Huntingdon and Peterborough leading from the St. Ives Road at West End, Somersham for a distance of approximately 250 feet in a south-westerly direction

across O.S. No. 98(F) and create an alternative highway in lieu. A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the Huntingdon and Peterborough County Council, County Buildings, Huntingdon and the St. Ives Rural District Council, Priory Road, St. Ives, and may be inspected free of charge at those places between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on weekdays except Saturdays between the period 19th June-26th June 1970.
