HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

*The London—Penzance Trunk Road
(Drybridge—Syon Abbey) Order 197*
and

*The London—Penzance Trunk Road
(Drybridge—Syon Abbey Side Roads) Order 197*

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. An Order under sections 7 and 44 of the above Act providing:

- (a) that a road which he proposes to construct between Drybridge in the parish of Dean Prior and Syon Abbey in the parish of Rattery in the County of Devon shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation; and
- (b) that the length of the London—Penzance Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the County Council of Devon (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new trunk road is open for through traffic; and

2. An Order under section 9 of the above Act authorising the Minister:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- (b) to stop up highways; and
- (c) to construct new highways;

all at or near Drybridge and Syon Abbey aforesaid, and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Devon as from the date on which the Minister notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are opened for through traffic.
