PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

Instruction to the National Board for Prices and Incomes withdrawing the instruction concerning the pay of University Teachers in Great Britain.

Whereas under section 3 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966 the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs made an Order (The Prices and Incomes (Continuous Review) (No. 1) Order, 1967, S.I. 1967/1581) and by virtue of that Order and in pursuance of their powers under section 3 (2) of the said Act, the Secretary of State for Economic Affairs and the Secretary of State for Education and Science, acting jointly, instructed the National Board for Prices and Incomes to keep under continuous review the remuneration of the academic staff of universities in Great Britain (the text of the said instruction being published on 2nd November 1967 in the *London Gazette* and the *Edinburgh Gazette*):

Now, the Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Secretary of State for Education and Science, acting jointly in pursuance of their powers under section 3 (4) of the said Act of 1966, hereby withdraw the said instruction to the Board.

PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

REPORT BY THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PRICES AND INCOMES

Pay and other Terms and Conditions of Employment of Workers in the Pottery Industry

1. On 24th October 1969, in pursuance of her powers under section 2 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity referred to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for their examination and report the pay and other terms and conditions of employment of workers in the Pottery Industry.

2. The Board has now made its report entitled "Pay and Other Terms and Conditions of Employment of Workers in the Pottery Industry". In accordance with section 5 (1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, the Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity hereby gives notice that the report was first published as Command Paper Number 4411 on 21st July 1970.
