

PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 31st day of July 1970.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in the Churchyard of St. Michael and All Angels, Aston Clinton, in the County of Buckingham, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 29th day of May 1970, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of St. Michael and All

Angels, Aston Clinton, in the County of Buckingham, shown hatched with thick lines on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

- (a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented;
- (b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Michael and All Angels' Churchyard, Aston Clinton, Buckinghamshire) Order 1970.
