## WATER ACTS

## MID CALDER WATER BOARD

*Water Act 1958**Water Shortage*

Notice is hereby given that in view of the serious deficiency of supplies of water in the area of the Mid Calder Water Board (hereinafter called "the Board") which exists or is threatened by reason of the exceptional shortage of rain, the Board are applying to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for an Order (to remain in force for six months) under the provisions of the Water Act 1958 as follows:

(1) During such time during the said period of six months as the total amount of water (available for distribution to consumers) in the Windleden, Upper Windleden, Snailsden, Harden, Broadstone and Whitley Reservoirs of the Board and between the top water level and twelve feet below the top water level of the Dunford Bridge Reservoir of the Board does not exceed 170,000,000 gallons

(a) to reduce by one half the compensation water which the Board are required by the Dewsbury and Heckmondwike Waterworks Act 1876, as amended by the Order relating to Dewsbury and Heckmondwike confirmed by the Local Government Board's Confirmation (No. 7) Act 1887 (hereinafter called "the Order of 1887") and as applied to the Board by the Mid Calder Water Board Order 1965 to discharge into the River Dun, so that the quantity of compensation water required so to be discharged during the hours over a period of seven days as so provided shall be not less than 6,954,000 gallons,

(b) to modify the restriction imposed by article 1 of the Order of 1887 so as to empower the Board to take water from the said Dunford Bridge Reservoir of the Board for their own use by means of a conduit laid at a depth not exceeding 42 feet below the top water level of the said reservoir.

(2) During such time during the said period of six months as the total amount of water in the Yateholme, Riding Wood, Ramsden and Brownhill Reservoirs of the Board is more than 140,000,000 gallons but not more than 175,000,000 gallons to reduce by one quarter the compensation water which the Board are required by the Batley Corporation Act 1921 as applied by the Mid Calder Water Board Order 1965, to discharge into the

River Holme, so that the quantity of compensation water required so to be discharged during the hours over a period of seven days as so provided shall be not less than 4,882,500 gallons.

(3) During such time during such period of six months as the total amount of water in the said last mentioned reservoirs of the Board is less than 140,000,000 gallons, to reduce by one half the compensation water referred to in paragraph (2) hereof so that the quantity of compensation water required so to be discharged during the hours over a period of seven days as so provided shall be not less than 3,255,000 gallons.

(4) To authorise the Board to supply water within their limits of supply by means of stand pipes or water tanks, to erect and maintain stand pipes of water tanks in any street within the said limits and to continue to raise, charge and levy the normal water rates and minimum charges while so doing.

Any objections to the application for the proposed Order may be made to the Minister of Housing and Local Government within seven days of the date of this notice.
