(Restriction of Waiting) Order 1970

The Minister of Transport proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Transport Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting of vehicles between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday in that length of the London-Aylesbury-Warwick-Birmingham Trunk Road (A.41) which connects the southern carriageway of the trunk road, known as North Western Avenue, with Otterspool Way at a point 795 feet west of the junction of North Western Avenue with Hartspring Lane.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the main-

nection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

The Trunk Road (King's Langley) (Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1970

The Minister of Transport has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 relating to the waiting of vehicles in that length of the A.41 Trunk Road known in part as Watford Road, in part as High Street and in part as Hempstead Road in the Parish of King's Langley, Hertfordshire, the effect of which is to:

(a) prohibit waiting:

(i) between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. (except Sundays) in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 hereto; or
(ii) between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. or 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. (except Sundays) in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 hereto; and

(b) prohibit loading or unloading between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. or 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. (except Sundays) in any of the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 hereto.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle except as in (b) above, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal

of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks of the 21st September 1970 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

(c) from a point 100 feet south of its junction with Rectory Lane to that junction.

(a) from a point 100 feet north of its junction with Church Lane to a point 100 feet south of its junction with Langley Hill;

(b) from a point 150 feet north of its junction with Langley Hill to a point 100 feet south of its junction with Vicarage Lane.

2. Hempstead Road

(a) from a point 100 feet point 100 feet south of its junction with Vicarage Lane. 1. High Street

(a) from a point 100 feet north of its junction with Vicarage Lane to a point 100 feet south of its junction with Common Lane;

(b) from a point 100 feet north of its junction with Common Lane to a point 100 feet south of its junction with Rectory Lane.

The M.11 London-Cambridge Motorway (Redbridge-Stump Cross Section) Side Roads Order 1970

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has in relation to the part of the M.11 London-Cambridge Motorway which will be situated between Redbridge and Stump Cross in Greater London and the County of Cambridgeshire and Isle of Ely respectively, made under sections 13 and 18 of the above Act an Order which:

- (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- (ii) to stop up highways;
- (iii) to construct new highways;
- (iv) to stop up private means of access to premises; and

- (b) provides for the transfer of each of the said new highways, (other than the new highway excepted in Article 4 of the Order), to the highway authority specified therefor in the Order as from the date on which the Minister notifies that authority that the highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.
