That the Troops which King Augustus had agreed to send into the Service of her Britannick Majesty and the States-General, had received Orders to be in a readiness to march on the 15th Instant, and that they had hitherto been re-tarded only by the Badness of the Ways. We hear from Vienna, by Letters of the 23d of the last Month, That the Conferences on the present Posture of Affairs conf-nued, and that Count Thaun was every Day expected on of Italy.
