The Order becomes operative as from 16th October 1970, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 9th October 1970, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

Notice is hereby given that on the 11th September 1970, the Stratford-on-Avon Rural District Council confirmed the under-mentioned Orders.

(a) The Stratford-on-Avon Rural District Council Tanworth-in-Arden (S.D. 295) No. 1 Public Path Diversion Order, 1970.

To divert the length of footpath commencing at Dairy Farm on the north side of Pound House Lane Dairy Farm on the north side of Pound House Lane in the Parish of Tanworth-in-Arden and proceeding in a northerly direction through garden O.S. 1551 and fields O.S. 1509 and 1507 for a distance of approximately 630 yards, and crossing the boundary hedge into field O.S. 1390 at the south-east corner of Chalcot Wood, to a line commencing at a point some 100 yards east of the existing footpath and proceeding in a northerly direction through fields O.S. 1387, 1388 and 1389 for a distance of approximately 610 yards reioining the existing footpath at the mately 610 yards rejoining the existing footpath at the aforementioned point in field O.S. 1390.
