Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Naval and Marine Reserves Pay Act 1957 (1957 c. 32) and section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865 (1865 c. 73) and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Naval Reserves (Gibraltar) Pay Amendment (No. 2) Order 1970.

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation Act 1889 (1889 c. 63) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3.—(1) The Naval Reserves (Gibraltar) Pay Amendment Order 1970 dated 28th April 1970 shall cease to have effect in respect of pay for continuous training on and after 1st March 1970.

(2) The Naval Reserves (Gibraltar) Pay Order 1968 dated 7th June 1968 shall be amended by substituting, for paragraph 1 of the Schedule to that Order, the following paragraph, which shall have effect from the date specified therein.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 16th October 1970, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £140,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 19th October 1970, to Friday, the 23rd October 1970, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
