TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS 1962 and 1968

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes, on the application of the Scunthorpe Borough Council, to make an Order under section 92 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968, for extinguishing any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on:

- (1) Market Hill;
- (2) Southgate;
- (3) High Street, from its junction with Cole Street to a point 155 yards east of that junction;
- (4) High Street, from its junction with Home Street to a point 55 yards west of that junction;
-) John Street, from its junction with Manley Street to a point 75 yards west of that junction;

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Trunk Road (Ilchester) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1970

The Minister of Transport proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles on the A.303 Trunk Road at Underter Someones to follows: Ilchester, Somerset as follows:

- (a) at any time in the length of road specified in Schedule 1 hereto;
- (b) between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. in the length or on the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 hereto; or

(c) between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on the side of road specified in Schedule 3 hereto:

(i) for a longer period than 30 minutes; or

(ii) if a period of less than 30 minutes has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on that side of road.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the main-tenance of the road or the services therein. The Order will also exempt disabled drivers from the time limits at (c) above.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan illustrating the proposal, may be inspected during all reasonable hours at the Post Office, High Street, Ilchester.

The Trunk Roads (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit)
(No.) Order 1970

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that, when roadworks at present being executed in Rochester Way, Bexley have been completed, he intends to make the above-named Order the effect of which will be:

(a) to revoke the existing speed limit of 40 m.p.h. in force on that length of Rochester Way, Bexley between the Greenwich/Bexley Borough Boundary near Crown Woods Way and a point 53 yards east of the eastern parapet of the river bridge at Bourne Road.

NOTE. Until roadworks have been completed the temporary 30 m.p.h. speed limit will remain in force on this length of road by virtue of an Order made by the Minister under section 12, Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, which Order suspended the 40 m.p.h. speed limit.
