HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

The Leeds (Inner Ring Road Stage III) Special Roads (Side Roads and Appropriation of Highways) Order 1969.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has confirmed with a modification the above Order which was made by the Council of the City and County Borough of Leeds under sections 13 and 18 of the above Act and which, as confirmed, provides for—

(i) authorising the Council—

- (a) to carry out the improvement of a highway,
- (b) to stop up highways,
- (c) to construct a new highway, and
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises,

(ii) appropriation of the following highways, namely, part of Westgate and Wellington Lane as part of the special roads which the Council are authorised by the Leeds (Inner Ring Road Stage III) Special Roads Scheme 1969 to provide.

Copies of the Order (as confirmed) and of the relevant plan may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Council of the City and County Borough of Leeds, Civic Hall, Leeds 1 and at the Ministry of Transport, St. Christopher House, Southwark Street, London S.E.1.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provisions contained therein, on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the 30th October 1970, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
