

boundaries of the properties on All Saints Road; then southwards along the east side of Station Road to and including Roselands and Alma Terrace and north-eastwards along the Sidmouth East Ward boundary as far as Salcombe Road, then southwards along the rear of the properties on Radway, High Street and Fore Street; then along the rear of York Terrace to and southwards along the River Sid, including the cul-de-sac.

B. The area within the boundary commencing at the junction of Beatlands Road and Milford Road, then southwards on the east side of Milford Road as far as and westwards along the rear boundaries of the properties on Salcombe Road as far as the garage; then north and eastwards along the west and rear boundaries of Cambridge Terrace as far as the west boundary of Canterbury House; then northwards to and including the Hall, following the west boundary of Sid Meadow as far as Sid Park Road, then eastwards to the Byes and northwards as far as the boundary to Bye Way; then eastwards to the south-east corner of Bella Rosa and north and eastwards as far as Sid Road, to include Sid Farm buildings; then south and eastwards to include Sid Lodge and following a straight line southwards as far as Redwood Road; then west to and south along the east side of Sid Road as far as and including Howleigh and Broad Oak, then east and southwards to include Salcombe Cottage building, June Cottage and Little Cote, then returning to point of commencement.

C. The area at Sidbury within the boundary commencing at the junction of Buckley Road and the south side of Bridge Street, following Bridge Street as far as Mill Race, then south and westwards to Fore Street along the rear boundaries of the properties on Bridge Street; then south-westwards on the south side of Fore Street to and including the building on Myrtle Farm dated 1614, north through the farmyard, across the footpath and along the west, then eastwards along the north boundary of the stables; then to and northwards along the rear boundaries of the properties on Fore Street as far as the stream, along the west side of the road as far as Ridgeway Farm, including the fields south of the farm; then eastwards following the field boundaries to and northwards along Cotford Road as far as and including the Old Forge; then to and southwards along the east bank of the River Sid to and along the north side of Church Street as far as the east side of Buckley Road, then returning southwards to the point of commencement along the east boundaries of the orchard and properties on the road.

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## WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

CIVIC AMENITIES ACT, 1967

*Conservation Area at Otley*

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire as Local Planning Authority after consultation with the Otley Urban District Council have designated the area referred to in the Schedule to this notice as a Conservation Area in accordance with section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act, 1967. The area is one which the County Council consider to be an area of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which should be preserved or enhanced and will be the subject of stringent control of development. The County Council intend to take such action as may be available to them to secure the preservation of the character and the general improvement of the area.

The Conservation Area is defined on a plan which may be inspected, free of charge, during normal office hours at the office of the County Planning Officer, Raines House, Denby Dale Road, Wakefield, at the office of the Area Planning Officer, Salisbury Buildings, Albert Street, Harrogate, or at the office of the Clerk of Otley Urban District Council, Council Offices, Otley.

### THE SCHEDULE

#### *Otley Urban District*

The Conservation area includes the town centre and part of the riverside. The northern boundary follows the south side of the Bridge Avenue and the southern boundary of the Cattle Market site to a point 700 feet south-west of Otley Bridge. The western boundary follows a line from the above point to Westgate, east of the garage, turns west down the centre of Westgate as far as No. 34 and south down Church Lane until the lane bends east. Here the Conservation Area boundary runs south-west for 60 feet and then south to the eastern wall of All Saints Vicarage being the southern extremity of the area. The area's southern boundary follows the south boundary of "Rosecot," Burras Lane, along the north side of Queens Place to Station Road to include 21 Burras Lane. It then turns north up Station Road turning east to include the frontages of Bondgate as far as No. 7 Gay Lane. It crosses the road diagonally to include No. 2 Bondgate and thence due north until it follows the south boundaries of the properties fronting Walkergate, east as far as No. 30 Crow Lane and including No. 14 Crow Lane.

The east boundary follows the east side of 35, 37 and 39 Cross Green crossing to follow the centre of Garnett Street and turns west along Courthouse Street as far as the Old Police Station. It turns north along the east boundaries of the properties fronting Brook Street, the Congregational Church, Sunday School crossing the river parallel to Otley Bridge 250 feet downstreet.
