Cheshire County Council (Footpath No. 11, Sandbach U.D.) Public Path Diversion Order, 1971

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 11th day of January 1971, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Cheshire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from a point approximately 230 yards north of Dingle Lane in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 220 yards to a line running from a point approximately 230 yards north of Dingle Lane in an east-north-easterly and northerly direction for a distance of approximately 250 yards to re-join the existing footpath.

Chelmsford Rural District Council (Danbury Footpath No. 10 (Part)) Public Path Diversion Order, 1970.

Notice is hereby given that on 1st January 1971 the Chelmsford Rural District Council confirmed the above-named Order.
