The Haringey (Various Roads) Experimental Traffic Order 1971

The Greater London Council give notice that they are about to make an Order, with the consent of the Secretary of State for the Environment, under sections 9 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be, in the London Borough of Haringey, to revoke (a) the Haringey (Various Roads) Experimental Traffic Order 1970 (G.L.C. 1970/20), which introduced a system of experimental traffic control, and (b) the Trunk Road (High Road, Tottenham) (Box Junction) (Experimental) Order 1970 (S.I. 1970/756), which imposed an experimental restriction on the driving of a vehicle into a boxed area at or near the junction of Seven Sisters Road and High Road, Tottenham in the said London Borough.

The systems of traffic control which were imposed by the Experimental Orders now to be revoked will be continued indefinitely by Orders made under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967.

The Order will come into operation not earlier than 29th January 1971.

WAITING RESTRICTIONS

London Borough of Croydon

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council are about to consider a proposal that they should make an Order under sections 6 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which would be, in the London Borough of Croydon, to impose restrictions on waiting by vehicles between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in:

Chipstead Valley Road (both sides) between a point opposite the party wall of Nos. 14-16 and 18 Chipstead Valley Road and a point opposite the party wall of Nos. 69 and 71 Chipstead Valley Road.

Christchurch Road the south-west side, between a point opposite the south-easternmost wall of Christ Church Vicarage and a point 60 feet north-west of the north-western kerb-line of Brighton Road, Purley.
