The Trunk Road (Various Streets, Talgarth) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of

which will be to prohibit waiting in the length of road specified in the Schedule below.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein, to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties or to enable the vehicle to take in

petrol, oil, water or air from any garage, situated on or adjacent to the subject length of road.

That length of the Glanusk Park (Crickhowell)—Talgarth—Llyswen Trunk Road (A.479), at Talgarth in the County of Brecon, known in part as Ennig Bridge, in part as Bell Street and in part as Regent Street, which extends from its junction with Market Square to a point 107 yards south-east of its junction with High Street, a distance of approximately 150 yards.
