

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE
CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT 1952

To: MR. ALEXANDER N. DRACOULIDES, last known address 106 Knollys Road, London S.W.16.

Dated 21st January 1971.

Pursuant to section 275(5) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the Customs and Excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely One Alfa Romeo Giulia 1600T1 motor car, registration number M1-AO-2884, chassis number AR 450464 has been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that on 20th March 1969 the vehicle, an Alfa Romeo Giulia 1600T1 motor car with registration number M1-AO-2884 was imported into the United Kingdom by Alexander N. Dracoulides who was at the relevant time a resident of the United Kingdom and was not entitled to any concessions relating to the importation of the motor vehicle under any of the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) Orders of 1968. Further no customs duty and/or purchase tax were paid by Mr. Dracoulides or any one else when the vehicle was imported into the United Kingdom and such customs duty and purchase tax should have been paid by Mr. Alexander N. Dracoulides.

In the alternative if the vehicle, registration number M1-AO-2884, had been imported into the United Kingdom on 20th March 1969 by Mr. Dracoulides when he was not a resident of the United Kingdom he would have been entitled to concessions in respect of the importation of the said motor vehicle under the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) (No. 2) Order 1968 but such concessions would be subject to the condition that the vehicle should be exported by Mr. Dracoulides on his departure from the United Kingdom or on 19th June 1969 whichever was the earlier and this was not done. In the alternative if the date 19th June 1969 (referred to above) had been extended to 19th March 1970 the vehicle should have been exported on or before that later date (19th March 1970) and this was not done.

Mr. Dracoulides departed from the United Kingdom some time between 1st June 1970 and 24th November 1970 and left the vehicle in the possession and for the use of George Strathdee (Junior), 542 Great Western Road, Aberdeen, Scotland, a non-entitled person within the meaning of that expression in the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) (No. 2) Order 1968 and the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) Order 1970 or in the alternative Mr. Dracoulides disposed of the vehicle to the aforesaid George Strathdee (Junior) a non-entitled person as stated above.

Whereby and by force of section 44 of the Customs and Excise Act 1952 and the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) (No. 2) Order 1968 and the Customs Duty (Personal Reliefs) Order 1970 the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a Solicitor in the United Kingdom who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
