INLAND POST AND POST TO THE CHANNEL ISLANDS AND THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND

Certain Letter Postage Rates

The rates of postage which the Post Office has fixed to be charged on and after 15th February 1971 on a letter (other than a preferred letter), the weight of which does not exceed 4 oz, being either an inland letter, or a letter for transmission to the Channel Islands or the Republic of Ireland, are as follows:

- (i) if transmitted as a first class letter ... 3p
- (ii) if transmitted as a second class letter 2½p (122)

POST OFFICE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CHARGES NOTICE E17/1971

The Post Office hereby gives notice that it is now possible to make telex calls without the assistance of a telex exchange operator from the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man to South and South West Africa.

The charges on and from 1st February 1971, for telex calls made from the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man to South and South West Africa are shown below. These charges have been fixed by the Post Office in accordance with regulation 2 (2) of the Telex Regulations 1965 (in force as a scheme under the Post Office Act 1969) and may be revised at any time by the Post Office.

Calls obtained with the assistance of an operator
£3 for the first 3 minutes (or part thereof); and
£1 for each subsequent minute (or part thereof).

Calls obtained without the assistance of an operator
£1 for the first minute (or part thereof); and
£1 for each subsequent minute (or part thereof).

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

ALDRIDGE-BROWNHILLS URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Urban District of Aldridge-Brownhills (Bullows Road, Brownhills) (Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1971.

Notice is hereby given that on the 4th February 1971, the Aldridge-Brownhills Urban District Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to restrict vehicles waiting in the whole of the length of Bullows Road on both sides to a maximum period of one hour in every two hours.

The Order will come into operation on the 11th February 1971; and a copy of the Order and a map showing the road to which the Order relates may be examined at the Council House, Aldridge, during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the 4th February 1971 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

ALDRIDGE—BROWNHILLS URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Aldridge—Brownhills Urban District Council (Bakers Lane, Aldridge) (One-Way Traffic) Order, 1971.

Notice is hereby given that the Aldridge—Brownhills Urban District Council in exercise of their powers under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, have made an Order the effect of which is to prohibit the driving of vehicles in that length of road specified in the first column of the Schedule to this notice otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to that length of road in the second column to the Schedule.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the length of road in question may be inspected at the Council House, Aldridge during normal office hours.

The Order will come into operation on the 11th February 1971.

Any person who desires to question the validity of any provision contained in the Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or on the grounds that any requirement of that section or of section 84A, 84B, or 84C of the Act or any regulation made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from the date of this notice make application for the purpose to the High Court.

ALDRIDGE-BROWNHILLS URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Aldridge-Brownhills Urban District Council (Valentine Close, Streetly) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1971.

Notice is hereby given that on the 4th February 1971, the Aldridge-Brownhills Urban District Council made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) section 84d of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which (except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform) will be to prohibit waiting at all times on that length of Valentine Close between the end of the houses and the school entrance and to prohibit waiting on both sides of the remaining length of Valentine Close between 8.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

The Order will come into operation on the 11th February 1971.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any complete operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the service therein, to enable post office vehicles to deliver and collect mail, and to enable vehicles to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

A copy of the Order, together with a map showing the length of road affected may be inspected at the Council House, Aldridge, during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of any provision contained in the Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 or on the grounds that any requirement of that section or of section 84a, 84b, or 84c of the Act or any regulation made under the said section 84c has not been complied
