He rath infant arrived here about 30 fail of Merchants fhips, English and Dutch, laden, most of them with Wines, Brandy, and Vinegar from France; one, French ship from Ireland bound for Rouen, and several English ships from

Befor in New England lad en with Tobacco bound for a Market. Several other English and Dutch vessels are put into Seilly, the wind not serving them to make this Port.

Legorn, March 10. This week arrived here the St. Intonio Abate, a great fhip of Genous bound for Smirns, and Conffantinople, and may this day put again to Ses.

- The Dutch Gonvoy may also fayl in 10. days for Smirna.

From Marfeilles we are told of the arrival there of leveral French Mariners, who in confequence of the late peace made by the French with the Corfairs of Algrer, were let at liberty and fent home. Six French men of war are fent to Tunk to renow the peace allo with that people.

The 5th inftant departed hence the Saphire Fregats, with the Conclusion and other fhips, bound for Venice, and on the 8th, the Portland Fregat, with the Ham-Bourg Merchant, Florentine, and leveral other thips bound for England.

The G cat Dike with all his Court, are this week expected here from Pifs.

Genoua, March 12. Several final English Veffels are lately arrived from Legorn and Marfeines to lade Marbics. The Differences between the Genouele and Savoyards upon the frontiers, seem to be ftill upon the Encrease, which has occasioned frequent Confultations here, and Obliged our Governours, to send down some perfons, to take an account of the true state of these affsirs, and to make report accordingly. His most Christian Majefty has in behalf of the Duke of Savoy, fent hither the Abbot de Servient his Ambassidour in that Court, to interpose in the faid differences, who has had his Audience at the Colledg, and is honourably entertained upon the account of this Republick.

From Turin we are advised of the arrival there of 2. Captains and one Li utenant with 53 Souldiers, the whole remainder of two Regiments, which were fent by the Duke to the affiftance of the Venetians during the fiege of Candia, 150 only furrived the Surrender of the place, who on their return homewards, were caff away upon the Coafts of Puglis, where perified Colonel Arborio, and Segnior de Cominges Maucidu perfons of Grear Conduct and Valour; and all the reft above the number above mentioned, who prefented to the Duke their Standard, which they preferted from the Wreck 3 who has formewhat repaired their loffes at Sea, by a liberal diffribution of Monies, Ordering them to be admitted 2 into his old flanding Regiment of Guards, and the Officers to be placed in Commands Equivolent to what they were preferred to in the Venetian lervice.

Hambourg, Mart. 14. The Count de Guldenter artiving here from England, lodged the 7th in Rant at Altenas and from thence d-parted the next morning with all dili4 gence for Copenhagen.

Some pallengers who left Copenhagen the 8th inftant

frozen, that divers people had paffed the Sound opon Sie,s, but that 13 of thole Sleds which were paffing to Schonen upon the Ice, were loft, with all the people that were upon them.

Letters from Stockholme tell us, that their Majefties were returned from Foachindal, where they had been fome time diverting themfelves; and the the Chancellour and leveral of the Senators were allo arrived at Stockholme, who all feem much fatisfied with the Letter from his most Christian Maj.fty, referring his differences with spain, about the limits in the Neatherlands, to the arbitration of His Majefty of Great Britain, and the Crown of Sweden, of which Sweden has accepted, and was Ordering their faid acceptance to be fignified to his wolf Chriftian M jefty.

From Warfaw we are told, that General Sierko, had fallen upon the party of Tartars (who to barbaroufly murdered the Coffacks Deputies returning from Poland) killing 300 of them upon the place, chaling the reft, and freeing above :000. women and children from Capitvity.

They farther write that the Polish Commissioners continue still upon the Confines of A uscows, the Coar having, only suspended the Conclusion of the Treaty with Poland, till he were fully in ormed how far the King of Poland was like to be allied to the House of Austria.

Venice, Mart. 15. Several thips lately arriving here from the Levant inform us, that Segnior Cavalier Moline was lately at Candia received and encertained by the Grand Vifier with all the resp. As and civilities imaginable; mutual vifus and actions of kindness also passing between him and most of the Turkish Ministers of that place.

They farther tell us, that the Vifier, who was fally reported to be embarked for the Grand Segniors Courts was preparing for that voyage, intending to take along with him the Cavalier *Mo ino*, and to introduce him to his Audience at Salonich, where the Emperour continues to divert himfelf with hunting and other tecreations, intending not to remove from thence til the arrival of the Vifier, by whole Prefence and Counfels he hopes with more ease to compose all the factions and oiffurbances at Conffantinople, which have been principally oceastion'd by hislong absence.

The Visier has fired up all the, Gullies which he had in the Port of *Candia*, obliging the people to contribute largely to the work, and has by the publication of a free Trade, and many immunities and priviledges to fuch perfons as shall come to inhabit that City, prevailed in his defign, and rendred the place very populous.

From Dalmatia we are informed, that the Turks with a party of about 200 Horle have lately made another incurfion about Zara, and met with fome booty, but the Countrey people taking the allarum, had fiript them of all their plunder, and revenged this injury by a vifit made to their territories, from whence they returned and brought away with them above 2000 head of Cattle

Since this the Governours of both parties have had, fome meetings, for the prevention of the like diforders for the fature, which they find to be a matter of great difficulty, confidering the nature of the people upon the borders, 'and their great inclination to rapine and violence , in which 'Trade they have been alwayes Educated.

Count Genstantin Ranieri Commander of the forces formerly Employed by the Pope, for the silifiance of this Republick against the Turks, has in Dalmatia received ved Orders from Rome, to return with his Regiment insorthe Ecclessifical State, to which he intends to give Obedience upon the return of General Barbaro, who is now in progres, viluing the feveral places of importance under his Government, whole leave he is to defire, as well as his affiftance for Inipping to pals over this men.

The new prefents which the publick were forced to prepare for the Turkifh Court, upon the unhappy mifcarriage of the fotmer, are enbarked upon the Gally Bracriana, which is Ordered theonveigh them to Zant, where other this are to take the charge of them: This Gally lies ready to put to Sca, :xpefting only the oportunity of good weather.

On Wednesslay lest, the great Councel made choyce of *Cavalier Molino* for their Bayly, or ordinary Minister to reside in the Turkish Court, which charge he is to enter upon, so soon as he shell have finisht his Extraordinary Embassie.

On Thuriday laft the Great Dike of Florence's Refident, went with a great Train to 'his Audience at the Colledg.

Fince Trivultio, who defigned to have continued fome months longer in this City, has a ely received Orders to depart immediately for *Milan*, to attend the new Governour upon his arrival.

Prince Erneft of Brunswick, is expected here from Rome on his return homewards. The Prince d' Holftein B other to the present King of Denmark, is here taking a View of the Curiofitie: of this place.

Bruffels, Mari. 25. Yeste lay went hence Count Marcin to take a view of the Uittadel and Fortifications there. Immediately after was proclaimed by beat of Drum at the Court gate, and other prices of this City, a Placart, commanding a l'Officer: to repair to their several Querters within the space of 2. hours, upon pain of death, a confidurble force is intended to be drawn to Ipres for the defence of that place till the fortifications, be compleated.

From Furnes we are told, that the 16th influent by order from the French Interfernt of those parts, great preparations are made of Corn, Hay, and Straw, for the fupply of their horfe which are to attend His most Christian Majefty in his vifit intended to his late Conquests, and a like case is also taken in other 1 aces.

An express from Arras in orms us of the arrival at a Village called St Paul within two Leagues of Arras of a great body of FrenchFoot with a proportionable Train of Artillery.

The Courier a-riving here on Friday laft from Spain, acquaints us, that it has pleafed the Queen Regent to conferre the Charge of Lieutenan: General of the Cavalry in the Netherlands, vacant by the removeal of the Prince de Ligne to the Vice-royalty of Sicily, upon the Dake de Villa Hermosa, a perfon of high birth and extraordinary merit.

Paris, Mart. 25. His 1 ajefty has thoughts of being prefent in Parliament before *Eafter*, to país leveral Edicts for the eafe and benefit of the people, the better to oblige them to his fervice, as 1 lo to fupprefs the Receivers of the Revenues belonging to the City, referving onely rwo of them, and to take avt at the Offices of Receivers of his Tailles as bardeniom and ulceles, intending for the future to have all these Collections made by the Gentlemen of each respective Province, who shall have power given them for that purpole, and be obliged to give in their accounts to the Trealury.

His Majesty farther designs, to take care that justice may be done freely. and without B ibes or Rewards, and insends that all Presidents, A vocates, Procurators General, and Lieutenants Civil and Criminal, shall act by a new Power an Commission

His Majefty frequently diver a himfell in taking the strews of his forces this laft week were drawn up before him his Musqueteets and feveral Compani s of Foot defigned for lea fervice.

The Turkih Minister may in little time take his leave in Order so-his return for *conflantstheple*, with whom is to be fent a Minister from hence to refide in the Ottoman Court in the room of Monsieur de la Hay, who fuddenly expects a difmission from that employment, but as yes, we have no certainty of the perion.

The fix fhips which have been fo long difcourled of for their intended voyage towards the Perfian Gulf, are now Equipped at Rochelie to be fent under the Command of Monfieur de Turelle, as Admiral, and Monfieur de la Hay lately Governour of St l'enant as Viceadmiral, which later is to Command 2000 men which are ordered to be embarked upon the faid men of war, to be employd, most of them at Madag afcar, whereof the faid de la Hay is to be Governour, aboard the faid fhips are allo to be fent 400 men which are to be drawn out of the Marine Regiment, under the Cammand of Monfieur de Lauardin.

The Dute de Longuevitle is luddenly expected here from Rome, where he was forme time lince made Prieft, and tis believed he interest to refign his Jitle of Duke to the Count de St Paul his Brother.

From Rome we are tol.⁴, that there is as yet little probability of a speedy Election, but the Prince Saveli, Governour of the Conclave, has declared, that no more of the Cardinals shall upon any presence of licknets or recovery, go out or enter into the Conclave, left under a pretence of an indisposition, they may privately carry on a N-gotiation with forreign Princes, which he justifies by a Buil of Pope Pins the V.

Bull of Pope Pius the V. Des', Mart. 18. Yesterday, arrived here a ship from Virgina with no other advice but what ipeaks the thriving and peaceable condition of those parts. This day, the wind being favourable, the Five East India ships failed out of the Powns.
