Coast Protection Act, 1949

Notice is hereby given that the Lothingland Rural District Council in their capacity as coast protection authority, hereby give notice under subsection (1) of section 5 of the above Act that they propose to carry out Coast Protection Work as described herein at Hopton-on-Sea (in the Parish of Corton) in the County of Suffolk.

The work will consist of the construction of:

(i) Permeable steel and timber revetment 700 metres in length. Five steel and timber groynes each approximately 60 metres in length spaced at intervals of 125 metres. The revetment will form a continuation of the works currently under construction along the frontage of the Gorleston Golf Course extending southward to join up with the northern end of the existing revetment sited in front of the Majorca Holiday Camp.

(ii) Reinforced concrete sea wall approximately 745 metres in length. Six steel and timber groynes each approximately 60 metres in length spaced at intervals of 125 metres. The sea wall will form a continuation of the sea wall currently under construction in the Beach Road area and will extend southward to a point just south of the Ministry of Defence site. The estimated cost of the work is £346,500.

Any person may not later than the 20th day of April 1971, serve written notice of objection to the above proposal on the Secretary of State for the Environment and on the above-mentioned authority. Any such notice must contain a statement of the ground of objection and must be sent by prepaid post to The Secretary, Department of the Environment, Whitehall, London S.W.1, and to the Clerk of the Authority at the address shown below. of the Authority at the address shown below.
