The Borough of Cheltenham (General Traffic Control) (Variation No. 4) Order 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Cheltenham Borough Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 and 28 jointly of the Road Traffic Regulation Act

1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, (which Act of 1967, so amended, is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967") by virtue of section 5 (1) of the Act of 1967 under sections 5 (2), 31 (1), 53 and 84D (1) of the Act of 1967, the effect of which will be:

 (b) To impose loading/unloading restrictions bebetween the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. and 5.30 p.m., except on Sundays in Bath Street, Henrietta Street, Imperial Circus, North Place, North Street, Pittville Street, Portland Street, Promenade, St. Margaret's Road and Winchcomb Street, and in parts of Albion Street, Bath Road, Cambray Place, Clarence Street, High Street, Imperial Square, St. George's Road and Warwick Place. Warwick Place.
- (c) To make consequential amendments to Schedule 4 of "The Borough of Cheltenham (General Traffic Control) Order 1964", as amended, the effect of which would be to remove certain disc parking places from the terms of the Order and to impose waiting restrictions of varying duration on the lengths of disc parking places which are proposed to be so removed.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order so far as the waiting restrictions are concerned to enable a vehicle to wait with police permission or for passengers to board or alight, for the loading or unloading of goods and for enabling works to be carried out in
