HIGHWAYS ACT 1959*The Neath—Abergavenny Trunk Road (Glyn—Neath  
By-Pass Side Roads No. 2) Order 1971*

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967*The Trunk Road (Newport Road and Bridge Street,  
Lower Fishguard) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1971.*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting in the length of road specified in the Schedule below.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein, or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
