## UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958, viz:

The Import Duties (General) (No. 4) Order 1971. This Order removes import duty from certain provisionally preserved gherkins, olives, capers and sweet capsicum, and certain dried garlic and sweet capsicum.

The Order comes into operation on 3rd June 1971 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1971 No. 858.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958. Viz:

The Import Duties (General) (No. 3) Order 1971.

This Order provides for the imposition as from 1st July 1971 of import duties on fresh, chilled or frozen mutton or lamb, except for goods imported from the Republic of Ireland, and also provides for increases in those import duties as from 1st January 1972 and 1st July 1972.

The Order comes into operation on 1st July 1971 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1971 No. 851.

CONTRACTURAL SAVINGS SCHEME CERTI-FIED BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 415 (2) (c) OF THE INCOME AND CORPORA-TION TAXES ACT, 1970.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury give notice, in accordance with paragraph 15 of the Prospectuses dated 1st October 1969 or both the Department for National Savings and the Trustee Savings Banks for Save As You Earn Savings Contracts (Series 1), that the restriction which provides that a person shall not enter into such a savings contract if the starting date under the contract would be less than a year after the starting date under another such savings contract entered into by him, shall from 1st September 1971 be altered to a month.

Notice is given in accordance with the aforesaid paragraph, also, that the restriction which provides that a person shall not enter into such savings contract if the aggregate of each monthly contribution which would be payable under the contract and of each monthly contribution payable under any other such savings contracts under which he is making payments would exceed £10, shall from 1st September 1971 be raised to £20.
