Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry, in exercise of the power conferred upon him by section 1 of the Opencast Coal Act, 1958, granted on the 24th day of May 1971 to the National Coal Board an authorisation entitled "The Nackshivan Authorisation 1971" to work coal by opencast operations or cause or permit coal to be worked by opencast operations.
