Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the North Riding of Yorkshire County Council, County Hall, Northallerton, not later than 15th July, 1971, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the County Council of the Administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

NEW TOWNS ACT, 1965

Redditch Development Corporation Compulsory Purchase Order No. 9, 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Redditch Development Corporation in pursuance of their powers under section 7 (1) (a) of the New Towns Act 1965 on the 27th day of May 1971, made an Order which has been submitted for confirmation by the Secretary of State for the Environment authorising them to purchase compulsorily for the purposes of residential development the lands described in the Schedule hereto.

A copy of the Order, and of the map referred to therein, has been deposited at the offices of the said Corporation at "Holmwood", Plymouth Road, Redditch and will be open for inspection without payment of fee between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive.

Any objection to the Order must be made in writing, stating the grounds of the objection and addressed to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Whitehall, London S.W.1, before the 16th day of July 1971.

The Secretary of State is not in all cases required to arrange for objections to be heard by a person appointed by him for that purpose. It is important therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.

Any owner or occupier of land to which the Order relates may send to the Redditch Development Corporation at the address below, a request in writing to serve him with a notice that the Order has been confirmed and naming a place where a copy of the Order and of the map and any descriptive matter annexed thereto, may be seen. Such a request should contain a statement of the name, postal address and the interest in the land of the owner or occupier, and particulars sufficient to enable the extent and boundaries of the land to be identified.

AMENDED NOTICE OF EXTINGUISHMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY ORDER

The Northumberland County Council (Footpath No. 10 in Woolsington Parish and Footpath No. 1 and 2 in Dinnington Parish) Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1971.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on the 6th May 1971, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Northumberland County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish the following public rights of way:

Footpath No. 10 in the Parish of Woolsington which extends from the Newcastle—Edinburgh Road A.696 to join Footpath No. 1, referred to below, at the Parish boundary.

Footpath No. 1 in the Parish of Dinnington which extends from its junction with Footpath No. 10 in the Parish of Woolsington, referred to above at the Parish boundary, to its junction with the Prestwick—Dinnington Road C.354.

Footpath No. 2 in the Parish of Dinnington which extends from its junction with Footpath No. 1, referred to above to the Prestwick—Dinnington Road C.354 near March Terrace.

The Northumberland County Council is satisfied that having regard to the changes that have occurred in the area, the mentioned rights of way should be stopped up as they are not required for public use.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Castle Ward Rural District Council, Council Offices, Ponteland and may be inspected there on Mondays to Fridays (inclusive) during normal office hours until the 7th July 1971.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned before the 7th July 1971 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Northumberland County Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
