The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 3 (6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958, viz:

The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 5) Order 1971.

This Order provides that the goods listed in Schedule 1 shall be temporarily exempt from import duty, and those listed in Schedule 2 shall continue to be exempt from import duty, both until 1st January 1972, except for items for which an earlier day is specified.

The Order also continues until 1st January 1972, the partial exemption for photographic film base of cellulose acetate.

The Order comes into operation on 1st July 1971, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1971 No. 1012.

RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS BY THE PUBLIC WORKS LOAN COMMISSIONERS TO LOCAL AUTHORITIES

The amount which an authority borrows within its annual quota as determined by the said Commissioners will bear interest at the appropriate rate in the lower set of rates. Where authorities borrow further sums these will attract interest in the higher set of rates, unless the said Commissioners agree that they should be offset against the following year's quota. Different rates of interest apply according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at maturity.
