Notice is hereby given that the County Borough of Northampton as the local highway authority proposes to submit to the Secretary of State for the Environment a Scheme making provision for the construction, as part of the proposed Southern High Speed Road, a bridge over the River Nene near Peaches Meadow, Bedford Road, Northampton. There will be a clearance of approximately 3 metres between the bridge and the normal river level and the bridge will span the river and the tow-path on both sides for a total distance of 55 metres.

Byelaws

Notice is hereby given that the Yorkshire River Authority intend to apply at the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice for the confirmation by the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food of byelaws made by the Authority for securing the efficient discharge of their functions. The proposed byelaws alter the annual close season for freshwater fish to the period from the 28th February to the 31st May (both dates inclusive) and relate to the better execution of the Salmon and Freshwater Fisheries Act, 1923, and the better protection and preservation of the fisheries in the River Authority area. During a period of one calendar month from the date of publication of this notice, a printed copy of the said byelaws will be deposited at the offices of the Authority, 21 Park Square South, Leeds LS1 2QG, and will be open to public inspection, without charge, on any weekday during the usual office hours. During the same period printed copies of the byelaws will be supplied on demand free of charge to any person appearing to the Authority to be interested. Any objection to the confirmation of the byelaws should be made in writing and addressed to The Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, Fisheries Department, Great Westminster House, Horseferry Road, London S.W.1, and should be received at that office before the expiration of the period of deposit of the byelaws. A copy of the objection should at the same time be sent to me at the address given below.
