MERIDEN RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Meriden Rural District Council (Stonehouse Farm, Allesley) Public Footpath Diversion Order, 1971

Notice is hereby given that the above Order, made on the 16th August 1971, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Meriden Rural District Council.

The Order relates to land situate in the parish of Allesley in the county of Warwick.

Its effect, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert that part of the public right of way (numbered M.252 on the Definitive Map prepared under the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949), running from Washbrook Lane in a north-easterly direction through the Farnyard of Stonehouse Farm for a distance of approximately 88 yards to a new line approximately 87 yards long, starting at a point in Washbrook Lane approximately 63 yards north of the junction of the existing footpath with Washbrook Lane and running in an easterly direction to its junction with the existing path.

CIVIC AMENITIES ACTS

GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

CIVIC AMENITIES ACT, 1967
Conservation Areas

Notice is hereby given that the Glamorgan County Council have designated as Conservation Areas the areas described below in accordance with the Civic Amenities Act 1967.

Dinas Powis

Land defined by the eastern boundary of Dinas Powis Common and continuing along the County highway (A.4055) for 350 metres and thence in a northerly direction to follow the rear boundaries of properties in Cardiff Road, Elm Grove, and Stacey Road. Thence along Mill Road as far as Millbrook Road and continuing in a westerly direction to include Dinas Powis Castle, St. Peter's Church and Castlewood Cottages. The western boundary extends in a southerly direction from these properties to include the Parish Hall continuing along Britway Road to the eastern limit of the Common.

Land associated with the settlement extending in linear form on both sides of the County highway. The eastern boundary commencing at the southern extremity of field parcel number 4785 following the hedgerow boundaries of field parcel numbers 4300, 3300, 2700, 3009 and 2712.
