Notice of Submission of Preliminary Draft Regulations entitled the National Insurance (Collection of Graduated Contributions) Amendment Regulations 1971.

In accordance with Section 108 of the National Insurance Act 1965, the National Insurance Advisory Committee give notice that they have received for consideration and report thereon the preliminary draft of regulations entitled the National Insurance (Collection of Graduated Contributions) Amendment Regulations 1971.

A short explanatory note on these regulations is appended to this notice.

The Committee will take into consideration any objection made by or on behalf of persons affected, received by them not later than 8th October 1971.

Explanatory Note

These Regulations revoke Part V of the Schedule to the National Insurance (Collection of Graduated Contributions) Regulations 1970 and replace it in a slightly amended form by a Schedule 2.

That Schedule sets out the provisions of the regulations dealing with the collection and recovery of Income Tax under Pay As You Earn in respect of seamen as modified to apply for the purposes of graduated contributions. In it have been made the consequential amendments necessitated by the making

of the Income Tax (Employments) (No. 6) (Seamen) Regulations 1970 which revoked and re-enacted in slightly amended form the Part V of the Income Tax (Employments) Regulations 1965.

As in the regulations revoked, the regulations in Schedule 2 are numbered non-consecutively, so that those provisions of the Income Tax (Employments) (No. 6) (Seamen) Regulations 1970, applied or adapted, retain for graduated contributions purposes the numbers which they bear in the latter regulations.

A new provision of substance is in regulation 11 of the new Schedule 2, corresponding to a similar provision of the latter Regulations under which Parts II, III and IV of Schedule 1 can be applied in certain circumstances instead of the provisions of Schedule 2.
