Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vhicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the

The Trunk Road (Various Roads, Cambridge)
(Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1971.

The Secretary of State for the Environment has made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

This Order applies to parts of the London-Cambridge-King's Lynn Trunk Road (A.10), and the Ipswich-Newmarket-Cambridge-St. Neots-Bedford-Northampton-Weedon Trunk Road (A.45) in the City of Cambridge and will have the following effect:

1. The introduction of a prohibition on the waiting of vehicles at any time on the new Chesterton Bridge Route and part of Chesterton Road as described in Schedule 1 to this notice.

2. The replacement of the existing restricted waiting applying from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, by a prohibition of waiting at any time on parts of Chesterton Road and the Mitcham's Corner Gyratory System as described in Schedule 2 to this notice. in Schedule 2 to this notice.

The ban on loading and unloading already applying on those roads described in Schedule 2 will remain

unchanged.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order for a vehicle waiting on a duly authorised parking place or to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle except as shown in Schedule 2, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolision. connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the main-tenance of the road or the services therein.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the 20th September 1971 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein. therein.
