

- (7) divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 525), in the Parish of Compton by stopping up the path commencing on the south side of the southern boundary of Markwells Wood, extending north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 1,580 feet and substituting for that path a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of six feet, commencing at the south-western end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, on the north side of the southern boundary of Markwells Wood, extending north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 1,560 feet.
- (8) (a) divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 526/2), in the Parish of Compton, by stopping up the path commencing at its junction with the public bridleway (Path No. 3009) at Robin Wood, extending south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 1,010 feet to Hill Barn, and substituting for that path a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing on existing bridleway (Path No. 3009), at Robin Wood, at a point 650 feet north-east of the north-western end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, extending south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 840 feet, to join the public footpath by Hill Barn, at a point 70 feet north-east of the south-eastern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up.
- (b) divert a further length of the public footpath (Path No. 526/2) in the Parish of Compton, by stopping up the path commencing at a point 1,620 feet south-east of the south-eastern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up described in (a) above, at its junction with the public footpath (Path No. 527), extending south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 900 feet, to join the western boundary of Bottom Copse, and substituting for that path a new length of public footpath a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing on the existing public footpath (Path No. 527) at a point 600 feet north-east of the north-western end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, extending south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 1,150 feet along the western boundary of Bottom Copse, to join the south-eastern end of that length of footpath proposed to be stopped up.
- (9) divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 3005), in the Parish of Compton, by stopping up the path commencing at the eastern boundary of Warren Copse, extending north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 1,200 feet to join the public bridleway (Path No. 491), and substituting for that path a new public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing at the south-western end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, extending generally northwards for a distance of approximately 1,150 feet, along the eastern boundary of Warren Copse, to join the public bridleway (Path No. 491) at a point 720 feet west of the north-eastern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up.
- (10) divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 3010/1) in the Parish of Compton, by stopping up the path commencing at its junction with the public footpath (Path No. 527) at the southern end of Compton Down, extending southwards for a distance of approximately 50 feet, thence eastwards for a distance of approximately 600 feet, and substituting for that path a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing at the eastern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, extending north-westwards for a distance of approximately 420 feet, to join the public footpath (Path No. 527).
- (11) divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 3011), in the Parish of Compton at Up Marden, by stopping up the path commencing at a point 370 feet north-east of Up-Marden House, extending north-westwards for a distance of approximately 2,130 feet, and substituting for that path a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing at a point 550 feet north of the south-eastern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, extending north-westwards for a distance of approximately 550 feet, thence northwards for a distance of approximately 1,350 feet, to join the north-western end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up.
- (12) (a) divert part of the public bridleway (Path No. 535) in the Parish of Stoughton, by stopping up the path commencing at a point 480 feet north-east of its junction with public bridleway (Path No. 534), at the eastern boundary of Forest Hanger, Stansted Park, extending north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 1,820 feet, and substituting for that path a new length of public bridleway, a minimum width of 9 feet, commencing at the south-western end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, extending generally north-eastwards along the eastern boundary of Forest Hanger for a distance of approximately 1,970 feet to join the north-eastern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up.
- (b) divert a further length of public bridleway (Path No. 535) in the Parish of Stoughton, by stopping up the path commencing at a point approximately 1,170 feet north-east of the north-eastern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, described in (a) above, at Rosamond's Hill, extending northwards for a distance of approximately 410 feet to its junction with the public footpath (Path No. 538), and substituting for that path a new length of public bridleway, a minimum width of 9 feet, commencing at the southern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, extending north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 250 feet, thence north-westwards for a distance of approximately 270 feet to join the northern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up.
- (13) divert part of the public bridleway (Path No. 533), in the Parish of Stoughton, by stopping up the path commencing at a point approximately 200 feet south-west of its junction with the public bridleway (Path No. 534), at a point 970 feet north of St. Paul's Church, Stansted Park, extending south-westwards for a distance of approximately 1,150 feet, and substituting for that path a new length of public bridleway, a minimum width of 9 feet, commencing at the north-eastern end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, extending southwards along the eastern field boundary for a distance of approximately 850 feet, thence south-westwards for a distance of approximately 450 feet along the drive leading to St. Paul's Church, thence north-westwards for a distance of approximately 520 feet to join the south-western end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up.
- (14) divert part of the public footpath (No. 519), in the Parish of Stoughton, by stopping up the path commencing at a point 400 feet south of its junction with the Forestside-Finchdean Road, opposite Woods Copse, where the path turns sharply eastwards, extending eastwards for a distance of approximately 1,180 feet to its junction with the public footpath (Path No. 523) at Warren Down, and substituting for that part a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing at the western end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up, extending southwards for a distance of approximately 270 feet to join the public footpath (Path No. 523).
- (15) extinguish part of the public footpath (Path No. 531), in the Parish of Stoughton, commencing at its junction with the public footpath (Path No. 3077) at a point 500 feet west of St. Paul's Church, Stansted Park, extending north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 2,600 feet to its junction with the public bridleway (Path No. 535) at a point 250 feet east of the eastern boundary of Forest Hanger.

Copies of the Orders as confirmed and the maps contained in them have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Chichester, between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

The Orders become operative as from 22nd October 1971, but if a person aggrieved by the Orders desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Orders he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 24th September 1971, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
