Cadiz, March z.

S Ir Thomas Allen is yet here, but intends within 2 or 3 dayes for the Streights, and to take under his Convoy fome thips confiderably laden, and amongft others the Briftol bound for Genoua.

Two French men of War are lately arived from Rochels and more daily expected.

From Sally we are advided, that the Emperour of Morocco, has with much civility exculed the Rop put upon the Lord Howards entrance into Barbary, by the danger himfelf was in, by realon of the infurrection and rebellion of his Nephews, he being unwilling to engage him in the Countrey; til he had rendred himself fufficiently powerful to protect him.

Since the reducing of the Rebels, the English which had been for fome time under reftraint, and imprifoned at Sally, were freed and are fafely arrived at Tangier, and Mr Warren the Secretary of the Embally, gone to attend the Emperour at Fez, about the mutual fatisfaction which was defined to be given for all injuries done during the Truce owned by the Emperour.

Warfam, Mart. 14. After an earneft conteft between Parz and Radzevil about the Election of a Marshal, the latter carried it for Lythuania, of which Province he was Vice-Chancellor, and accordingly His Majesty was acquainted with the choice. The next day was defigned for their folemn kiffing of His Majesties hand, which was put off till Monday, that the Queen might be present so fee the Ceremony.

On saturday Count schaffgotz, the Emperours Ambalfador Extraordinary made his publick Entry with great pomp and Iplendor, he has fince performed the bulinefs of his Embaffy, and congratulated the Marriage, and is already preparing for his return home.

The next day the Queen entred with Extraordinary Magnificence, the Citizens being drawn into Arms to receive her, and most of the Nobility attending her with their Coaches, or elle on horfeback; their Majeffies entred in a rich Coach drawn by 8 excellent horfes, followed by all the Guards.

On Monday, the King took his feat under a Canopy of States to receive the Equeitrian Order, the Senators being feated on each fide of him, and the Queen with her Ladies placed in a Gallery to behold the Ceremony, which was long expected, feveral disputes between them and their Marefhal, deteining them neer Three hours, who at the laft, fo far complyed with them, as to fwear upon his Word and Honour not to do any thing contrary to the publick refolution.

That his Majefty would caufe the Pasta Conventa to be openly read: his Majefty willingly granted the tormer, but much (crupled the last; but finding them refolved not to proceed upon any other bufiness till this were granted, them, the King called them back as they were going out, and promised it though be done on the morgowa It has been fince this Affembly refolved, that no fingt. perfor should have the power to break up the Diet, but if any one found himfelf grieved, he should prefent his faid grievance to his Majelty and the Senate, where it should be heard and determined.

The fame Munday his Nojesty invited all the publick Minifters, Senators, and Deputies to a great Bunquet, the Popes Nuncio, and the Emperors Ambassador were placed at the fame Table with their Majessies, the Nuncio taking the upper hand.

Here are now in Town fome Ambaffadors from Dorofonsko, who in their Audience, defired his Majefties affiftance against Hanigow, the head of the Rebel Collacks and the Turks, who have already feized fome places belonging to the Collacks : his Maj fly was pleased to give them a favourable answer, expressing his inclination to take them under his effectal care, and that he intended this Summer to come in person to their affistance,

Rome, Mart. 15. On Munday last Cardinal Barbarini different his interest in the Conclave, where upon a feruriny in favour of Cardinal Rospiglioss, his party was found to amount to Thi, ty three Votes, besides four others who are at prefent out of the Conclave upon the account of their indisposition of body, which made no simult impression upon Cardinal Chigy, e pecially, fince amongs the number he found Vidoni, Franzone, and Spinola, whom he supposed to have been his Creatures and obliged to espouse his interest only.

The Cardinals di Medicis, Francifco Barba ini, and Chigi, the heads of the feveral factions have lately had fome conference in order to the putting an end to the Conclave, of whole long continuance they begin to be very fenfible, and tis faid is has been moved, that Six Cardinals may be nominated our of the whole Colleage, out of which number they intend to make choice of one to be preferred to the Papacy.

The perfons who are most discoursed of at present as ftanding fair for the Election are the Cardinals Carpegns and Brancaccio. Cardinal Barbarino is faid to have disparche a Courier to the French Court in favour of Facebinetti, but the squadron seem rather inclined to Odefcalchi, a perfor not wedded to any f. ction.

I here is lately much discourse of a famous Gid of Rimini, who either by pretended Divine power, or Diabolical Arts, has done many wondrous things and amongst others, fell 300 times in one night into trances or extaines, in which the frequently seemed to foretell that Cardinal Barbarino fhould succeed in the Papsey.

On Saturday last the Constable Solonna gave an Extraordinary entertainment at bis Countrey house Pansitia, to the Dutchelles Magarini, Sforga, and Bassanello, and to the Dutkes of Brunswick, Roano, and Nevers, with the Earl of Northumberland, and many other perions of the greatest Eminency, who were asterward diverted with feveral Recreations by the Prince Pamsitio, and Treated with an excellent Banquet.

The Duke of Brunfwick is fince departed on his way to Venice.

Legorn, Mart. 17. The 13th inftant departed hence Sir John Harman, with Captain Darcy, and the Junkine for Junk, intending to return by Mellina to this place and to take under his Convoy the Merchant thips, expected from Fuglia and Zante. The 12th inftant artived here the Mary Pink from Ireland, and yesterday the William and Ralph Keych from Naples, intending to re-

turn homewards in company of the Dutch Convoy of 14 fail of great fhips, bound for Spain and Holland.

The Great Duke is with his Court expected here this week from Pife, but the young Prince Francisco is to return immediately for Florence.

Madrid, March 18. Yefterday in the morning dyed the Marquis of Aytona in the Pallace, where he was princicipally Major Domo to the Queen Regent , a great favority, formerly by the late Kings will named a member of the Councel for the Government, and lately made Colonel of the new Regiment of Guards.

The Arch-Bishop of Thoulofe the French Ambafisdour, who arrived here the first instant, expects not his publick Audience before Eafter.

The Conde de las Arcas, is made Captain of the Spanifh Guard, in the room of the deceased Marquis de Salinas, the only Son to the Duke de Cardona; who dyed above a Months fince, is also lately deceased.

Genoua, Mart. 19. The 16th inftant departed hence the French Envoy, accompanyed by feveral Gentlemen of this place, instructed for the adjousting the differences upon the Confines about Trivola, between the Savoyards and the subjects of this Republick , a Gally being appointed to conduct them to St Kime, and there to attend them ; but little effect can be expected fom all the endeavors which shall be used in this affair, unless the Dake of Savey be pleafed to concur heartily toward the establishmenvof the peace.

Yetterday strived two Galliasses, belonging to the fquadron of the Dake of Turfi : two others of the fame Iquidron being left at Finale on Saturday laft, where they landed the Duke of Offuna, the New Governor of Mi-I.m, in which place great preparations are made for his reception, bus tis believed, fonze disputes may arise between him and the Marquis de los Ba baces Spinola, the latter, being obliged by his Character of Ambaflattor Extraordinary to the Emperour, to infift upon precedency, which the Dake is not inclined to give him.

Venice, March 21. Several thips are lately arrived here from or fu and Zant, telling us that the Captain General Morofini, and Monfieur de St Andre Montbrun intended very luddenly to Bmbark chemfelves in Order to their Voyage for this place. They farther confirm to us, the report of the Great pains

the Grand Vifier has taken to invite the Greeks to come over and inhabit the City and Kingdom of Candia, by granting them habitations and priviledges, which have al-ready drawn great numbers thither : He has also ordered the profits and revenues of the Kingdom, in reference to the Grand Segnior, to the yearly tribute of four hundred thousand Reals, with which are to be maintained 8 Gallyes, 3.00 foot, and 1000 horfe for the Emperors fervice. The Visier is preparing for his journey to Salonich, and has informed Seigneur Cavalier Molino of his Intentions, that he may be in readine's to Embark with him.

The Gally Bracciana will in few dayes be ready to put to fea, with the presents designed for the Ottoman Court, which are to be delivered to the Charge of Seigneur Ansonio Zen an Officer of the Arfenal.

The Senate having confidered how much the Arfenal has been disfarnicht of its Armes during the laft war, has given Order for the making of 14 thouland Mulquets in Brefsia, half of them firelocks, with a proportionable quantisy of other wespons , for the fupply of the Arfenal.

Hague, April 1. The 29th pak the States of Holland adjourned till the 15th inftant, and the fame day the States Deputies had a long conference with the Councel of State, about the recruits of the Army, which is believed will be Suddenly undertaken.

The Marquis de Rifancours Envoy from the Duke of Torvain, leems not to drive at any other negotiation, then unly to follicit the States, to interpole in the Compolure In the differences between his Mafter, and the Prince Edeftor Palatine, to which they had offered their Media-100.

The Forces which the Biltop of Munster is to lave in readinels, according to the Retolution of the States of the Empire at Ratisbonne, as his proportion to be, employed for the defence and lecurity of the Empi. c , are in readinels to march upon the first Orders-they shall recieve. The Bishop feems not to have any intention of ra-fing any others in their room, having refuled the profiler'd fervice of feveral Officers, and refolved to aitmit's 20 others, to whom he has allowed penfions to retain them.

Vice Admiral Van Ghent is at Amsterdam, and intends within less then a Moneth, to put to lea with his Squadton defigned for the Streights.

Paris, April 2. The 12 Companies of the Regiment of Guards which were fent into Flanders are arrived at Lille, and are to be placed in Garriton in the new Littadel there, in the room of 12 hundred other f laters which are to return home, and to encamp at St Schaftian, where his Majesty intends to have in Arms and daily exercise during this next Summer, abody of about ten thouland men.

So foon as his Majefty has made his is tended vifit to his new Conquefts, he defigns another progress into Languedoc, to take a view of the new Channel for the intercourse between both seas, which is so far advanced, and fo many men employed about it, that tis believed that great work may arrive at lome perfection within Fifteen Moneths.

From Bayonne we are informed, that part of the Conde de Molina's Frain, with his Secretary, is there arrived, himfelf intending fuddenly to follow, as Ambaffador from the Crown of Spain, bringing with him confiderable Prefents from the Queen Regent, f r the Dauphin, Duke of Anjou, and Madam of France.

Monfieur de Gravelle, the French Envoye is lately arrived at Meniz, endeavouring to prevent the Concusion of a Treary with Holland for the free transportation of Wines from Franconia.

The diffurbances in Hungary are not yet compoled, many of the Grandees of that Kingdom, being, contrary to the Emperors Order, affembled at Caffevia, with a defign of felling to the Turks 10 confiderable Towns bordering upon Transvivania; but General Monteeucali and the Count de Nadafti have drawn together 8000 mer., intending to reduce them to obedience. A Grandfon of Bethlem Gabor, tormerly Prince of Transylvania, who was wrought upon by the Visier of Offen, to e poule the Octoman interest and has had no small influence upon the Hungarian Nobility, lately dyed fuddenly at Cafforia, not without a fulpition of poyfon.
