Monsieur de Gravelle, the French Envoye is lately arrived at Mentz, endeavouring to prevent the Concusion of a Treaty with Helland for the free transportation of

Wines from Franconia.

The disturbances in Hungary are not yet composed, many of the Grandees of that Kingdom, being, contrary to the Emperors Order, affembied at Caffevia, with a design of selling to the Turks 10 considerable Towns bordering upon Fransilvania; but General Monteenculi and the Count de Nadafti have drawn together 8000 mer., invending to reduce them to obedience. A Grandson of Bethlem Gabor, tormerly Prince of Transylvania, who was wrought upon by the Visier of Offen, to e poule the Octoman interest and has had no small influence upon the Hungarian Nobility, lately dyed suddenly at Cassouia, not without a fulpition of poylon.
