

**TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS  
1962 AND 1968**

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that on the application of the Bristol County Borough Council he proposes to make an Order under section 92 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968 to provide for the extinguishment of any right which persons may have to use vehicles on a length of Guinea Street, Redcliff, Bristol.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of that highway by vehicles being used:

- (a) for police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;
- (b) on behalf of a statutory undertaker or the Post Office and engaged upon the laying, erection, alteration, repair or removal in the highway of any main, pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878.

During 28 days from the 28th October 1971, copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the Town Clerk's Office, The Council House, College Green, Bristol, and may be obtained, free of charge, from the Secretary of State (quoting TTPA 7/146/02) at the address stated below.

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 153 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962 and section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968 entitled "The Wallsend Hadrian Road Extension Road Scheme (Stopping up) Order 1971" authorising the stopping up of parts of Point Pleasant Terrace, Ford Terrace, Back Point Pleasant Terrace/Ford Terrace, Potter Street, Bewicke Road and Back Potter Street all at Wallsend.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Department of the

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Acts or that any requirement of those Acts or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the 28th October 1971 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968 (subject to the granting of planning permission under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962 for the improvement of Bell Green, Sydenham Road and Southend Lane, Lower Sydenham, London S.E.26), to authorise the stopping up of a length of Bell Green Lane and parts of Haseltine Road and Holmshaw Road in the interests of the safety of the users of and to facilitate the movement of traffic on the highways to be improved as aforesaid by the Lewisham L.B.C.

The proposed Order will require the provision of new roads maintainable at the public expense, for which the highway authority is to be the Lewisham L.B.C.
