BY THE QUEEN A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING CERTAIN PROCLAMATIONS MADE UNDER THE COINAGE ACT 1870 SO FAR AS THEY RELATE TO THE BAHAMA ISLANDS, BERMUDA, THE CAYMAN ISLANDS AND MONTSERRAT.

ELIZABETH R.

We, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Coinage Act 1870 and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

1. The Proclamations set out in the first column of the Schedule hereto are revoked in so far as they relate to the territories set out opposite thereto in the second column of the Schedule.

2. This Proclamation shall be published in the official Gazettes of the Bahama Islands, Bermuda, the Cayman Islands and Montserrat and shall come into force in each of those territories on the date of its publication therein in the official Gazette.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-seventh day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventy-one and in the twentieth year of Our Reign.

We, therefore, in pursuance of section 11 of the Coinage Act 1870, as extended by section 15(5) of the Decimal Currency Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:
