The QUEEN has been pleased to award The Queen's Police Medal for Gallantry to the late Constable Ian Coward of the Thames Valley Police in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:

A car driven by two criminals, who had stolen it for the purpose of committing further crimes, was stopped by Constable Coward because of the erratic way in which it was being driven. Suspecting that the car had been stolen, Constable Coward returned to his own vehicle to use its radio set to check the registration number of the suspect car. He was prevented from doing so by one of the men, who threatened him with a gun and told him to hand over the radio set. Constable Coward refused and tried to seize the gun, but was shot in the head. Despite this injury he refused to yield to his attacker and, while fighting and struggling, he was shot a further eight times. The men then drove off, leaving Constable Coward unconscious on the pavement. He died of his wounds four weeks later. His courage and devotion to duty were in the highest traditions of the police service.
