From the Camp at Cancan, between Elvas and the Guadiana, June 27. N.S.

THE Enemy continues the Blockade of Olivença, part of their Forces being encamped before that Place, and part at Thelene; but helides that they have found Means to supply the Town for fifry Days, the Sealon is to far advanced, that they cannot lye much longer before it, but both Armies will be obliged to march into Summer Quarters within few Days. On the seventeenth Instant the Marquis de Fronteira, General of the Portugueze Army, detached three Regiments of Horle and two or Foot to Surprize Alcantara, being advised that there were but a few Troops, and those of the Militia in Garrison; but this De achment, upon receiving fresh Luelligence, made a Hale near that Place, and we are as yet unacquainted with the Success of this At-tempt. Deferiers report that the Enemy defigned to fend a Rein orcement of Horfe and Foot to the Army on the Frontiers of acalemia.

Genoa, June 16. N. S. Mr. Chetwynd, the British Minister residing in this Republick, went last Week for Vado, in order to embark the Troops designed for Catalonia, and Sir Edward Whitaker sailed with them on Friday. Fourteen hundred Men were shipped off for the German Regiments; and the Spinish Envey, who accompanied Mr. Chetwynd, embarked eight hundred for the Italian; the whole consisted of two thousand two hundred Men. By an English Galley arrived larely at Leghorne we have Advice, that Sir John Jennings was seen off of Ivica ren Days ago, with tevenieen Sail of Men of War, the Victuallers and Storeships from Lisbon, bound for Port Mahon; which in all probability must be at this time arrived there. The Duke d'Uzeda, who was the Duke of Anjou's Amiassador to the Court of Rome, arrived here yesterday Morning; and having taken a House, it is believed he may stay some time at this Place.

Vienna Jove 19. N. S. General Pflug and someother Muscovite Officers are lately arrived here from the Muscovite Army in Ukrania. It is about two Mon.hs since they came from thence; they say, that according to the Report of the Swedish Pritoners and Cossack Deferters, the King of Sweden's Army was at that time about four and twenty thousand strong. General liftug having had Audience or the Emperor, is gone to execute his Commission at the Fourt of Dr. sen. The Inhabitants of Moravia have signified to this Court their Fears of an Irruption from the Hungarians; there being but sew Troops let in those Parts to cover their Franciers. The Duke of Wirtemberg arrived here two Days ago.

Berne, June 29. N. S. Repeated Advices from Geneva give an Account of Insurrections in the Vivarez, and in the Cevennes. These Letters add, that the Duke of Requelture, with the Intendent of Languedoc, was gone towards Usez with two Regiments of Dragoons, and two Battalions, in order either to fall upon these Malecontents, or to hinder their Communication with those of the Vivarez. Seventy Persons of an Assembly that was held near Nimes for their Devotion, have been seized, the Men are condemned to the Galleys, the old Women Imprisoned, and the young Transported to the Isle of St. Marguerite. An Order has been likewise published to sire upon all such as shall assemble for the stature.

Hamburg, July 5. N S. According to the last Advices from Saxony, his Darish Majesty, accompanied by King Augustus, left Dreiden on the twenty ninth past in the Morning, having been saluted at his Departure by a triple Discharge of the Artillery. Both the Kings will, it is said, after a short stay at Potsdam, come this way, to review some Danish Troops that are to reinforce those coming from Hungary. The Day before King Augustus set out, a Person of Distinction arrived at Dresden from Poland, and had a long Audiense of : 0.h their Majesties

which caused some new Discourses of an intended Expedition, the Saxon Officers having all received Orders to have their Troops compleated before the latter end of this Month, and to be in a readiness to March upon the first Orders. We hear from Riga, that a Muscovie Rody of twelve thousand Men, with a good Train of Artillery, was marching directly owards Perusu, with design to attack that Place, wherein but a small Swedish Garrison is left, the best Troops having been drawn out or all the Places in Livonia, in order to reinterce General Crassau and King Stanislaus. The Burghers here continue obstinate in their Animosities, having met twice in a smaller number than the Constitution requires, so that nothing could be transacted by them. The British Convoy, with a good number of Merchant Ships, is still kept by contrary Winds upon the Elbe.

From the Camp before Tourcay, July t. N. S. On Friday the 28th past the Duke of Marlborough received an Account from the Easl or Orkney, that his Lor-ship had taken puffession of Mortagne without any Opposition, the Garrison, confisting of near an hundred Men, having retired upon the approach of our Troops, who feized between that Place and St. Amand tix large Boats laden with Hay, deligned for the use of the Enemy. On Saturday the Governor of Tournay gave Orders for burning the Suburbs, which were executed that Evening, to prevent our Mens taking the Advantage of them in their Approaches. The Troops appointed to form the Siege being thirty Rattalions and as many Squadrons for each fide the Schelder are marched to their respective Ground as near the Place as may be; and the disposition is making for three Attacks, one on each fide the River against the Town, and the third against the Cit adel; each Attack is to be commanded by a General of the Feor, with three Lieutenants General, three Majors General and four Brigadiers and Orders are iffued to the Magistrates of the neighbouring Towns and Country, to fend hither by the third Instant near Fifteen thousand Pioneers, which are to be employed in making the times. Two or three Bodies of the Enemies Troops, of about a thousand Men cach, have been hovering for three Days past about the Carop, to endeavour to throw some Men into the Town, but, by the Orders that were taken, have been hitherto prevent-The Prince of Frife having left a thouland Meh under the Command of a Brigadier at St. Amend, and a Colonel with leven hundred Men at Mortague, is returned with the Earl of O.kney, Monfigur Hompefch, and the rest of their Troops to the Camp.

From the Camp before Tournay, July 4. II. S. The Troops employed in the Siege of Tournay having taken their Posts round the Place from the Caitle of Constantin below the Town to Cercq, above it, (at which Places we have laid Bridges of Communication over the Schelde) the two Armies have thereupon made a small Movement. That Commanded by the Prince of Savoy 15 encamped with the Right at Luchin, and the Lett at Efplechin; and that under the Command of the Duke of Mariborough extends from the Right near the Brock of Esplechin, and the Left at Espain. The Peasants summoned to make the Lines of Circumvallation have been at Work these two Days, and have aiready almost finished those on the Hainault fide of the River, and our Tropps have prepared great numbers of Fascines and Gabious id be made use of in the Approaches. The heavy Arrelery and Ammunition are come up the Schelde as far as Attdenarde, from whence they are expected here in two or three Days. Monsieur de Villemore, a French Brigadieri with a Captain of his Regiment, were taken two Days fince within our Lines, diguised in the Habits of Peafants, as they were endeavouring to get into the Town. The Marefehal de Villars continues wills his Army encamped near la Bassée and Lens; tront whence he ha h fent feveral Detachments this way, in order to watch an opportunity of throwing Men into the Town.
