

## PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 22nd day of December 1971.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Holy Jesus, Lydbrook, in the County of Gloucester, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853 as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in Lydbrook Churchyard, in the said Parish, as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

In any earthen grave in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed at their decease of the bodies of Florence Ivy Gunter, John Bennett, Doris Davis, George Wilks, George Alan Walker, Albert Morgan, Annie Morgan, Lilian Knight, Thurza Wilson, Sidney Partridge, Florence Brooke, Marion Walker, George Watkins, Alice Watkins, Rhoda Pretoria Ward, Christopher

Evans, Caroline Cox-Meredith, Kathleen George, Ella May Bartlett, Elsie Head, Laura Taylor, Hilda Whitehouse, Harold Lionel Brain, Gwendoline Ward, Isabel Miles, May Smith, Hilda Watkins, Leslie Lewis, Miriam Powell, Edwin Eli Toomer, Charlotte Maude Childs, John Hale, Mary Davis, Raymond Augustus Morgan, Ethel Maud Hatton, Isaac Thomas Brooks, Eliza Taylor, Phoebe Gibbs and Gladys Fanny Tamplin, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 25th day of February next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 25th day of February.
