Diseases of Animals Act 1950

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act 1950 that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, have made the following Order:

Statutory Instruments 1971 No. 2053.

The Newcastle Disease (England and Wales) Order 1971

(Made 16th December 1971)

This Order, which came into operation on 1st January 1972, provides that the Fowl Pest Order of 1936, as amended, shall no longer apply in relation to Newcastle disease in poultry in England and Wales. Under the provisions of the new Order, which applies to England and Wales, Newcastle disease remains a disease notification of the existence of which is required to be made as soon as practicable to a police constable or to a veterinary inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food. The owner or person in charge making the notification is required to retain on the premises all poultry and carcasses, and to prevent, so far as he legally may, the admission of persons until a diagnostic visit has been made. The vaccination of poultry against Newcastle disease with an unlicensed vaccine is prohibited.
