*The Borough of Colchester (Mile End Road and Turner Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1971*

Notice is hereby given that the Colchester Borough Council have made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles in the lengths of road set out in the Schedule to this notice between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive.

*Lengths of Road in the Borough of Colchester*

Mile End Road, on the west side, from a point opposite the south wall of No. 30 Mile End Road to a point opposite the boundary wall between Nos. 69 and 71 Mile End Road.

Turner Road, on both sides, from a point 45 feet from its junction with Mile End Road to a point opposite its junction with Public Footpath No. 224. (432)

*The Borough of Colchester (East Hill and Brook Street) (Prohibition of Right-hand Turn) Order, 1972.*

Notice is hereby given that the Colchester Borough Council have made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to prohibit any vehicle from making a right-hand turn from East Hill into Brook Street between the hours of 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday.

## COLCHESTER BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The Borough of Colchester (Old Heath Road and Recreation Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1971*

Notice is hereby given that the Colchester Borough Council have made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is:

(a) to prohibit the waiting of vehicles in the following lengths of road:

Old Heath Road, on both sides, for a distance of 90 feet south-east from the termination of the present waiting restrictions;

(b) to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily in the following lengths of road:

Old Heath Road, on the north side, from a point opposite No. 15 Old Heath Road to a point 45 feet south-east of the junction with Recreation Road.

Recreation Road, on both sides, for a distance of 45 feet from its junction with Old Heath Road.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the lengths of road to which the Order relates may be inspected at my office during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the said section 1 or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of sections 84A, 84B or 84C of the said Act or any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order is made, make application to the High Court.

## CAERNARVONSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

*The County of Caernarvon (Aberdaron) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1971*

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the Administrative County of Caernarvon on the 29th December 1971, made an Order under sections 1 and 84(D) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which:

(a) will be to prohibit waiting from the 1st May to the 15th September in any year (both dates inclusive) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m.

(i) in the roads or in any lengths of the roads or in either sides of the roads specified in the First Schedule hereto;

(ii) for a longer period than 1 hour return prohibited within 1 hour in the roads or in any length of the roads or in either sides of the roads specified in the Second Schedule hereto;

(b) revokes the Caernarvonshire County Council (Aberdaron) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1968.

The usual exceptions have been made in the Order to enable the loading and unloading of goods and passengers, work in connection with building demolition, highway and public utility undertakings.

A copy of the Order and a map showing its effect, have been deposited at the Offices of the Lleyen Rural District Council, Council Offices, Pwllheli and at the County Offices, Shirehall Street, Caernarvon, where they may be inspected from Monday to Friday between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

The Order will come into force on the 18th February 1972.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks from the 29th December 1971, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

## THE FIRST SCHEDULE

(i) on both sides of the length of the Aberdaron—Llanbedrog Road, Aberdaron in the County of Caernarvon between the south side of Pont Fawr and a point 235 metres north-east of the eastern side of its junction with the road leading to Uwch Mynydd.

(ii) on both sides of that length of road in Aberdaron aforesaid leading to Uwch Mynydd from its junction with the Aberdaron—Llanbedrog Road to the easterly side of its junction with the road leading to Capel Deunant in Aberdaron aforesaid.

(iii) on both sides of that length of the Aberdaron—Rhiw Road, Aberdaron aforesaid from a point 16 metres east of its junction with the Aberdaron—Llanbedrog road to a point 350 metres east of that junction.

(iv) on the north side of the Aberdaron—Rhiw Road, Aberdaron, aforesaid for a distance of 16 metres east from its junction with the Aberdaron—Llanbedrog Road, Aberdaron aforesaid.

(v) on the west side of the Aberdaron—Llanbedrog Road, Aberdaron aforesaid from the south side of Pont Fawr to a point opposite its junction with the Aberdaron—Rhiw Road.
