The Salop County Council (Footpaths 149 and 157 at Broseley) Public Path Diversion Order 1971

Notice is hereby given that on the 11th November 1971, the Salop County Council confirmed the above named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way known as Footpath 149 at Broseley in the County of Salop running from a point 139 yards north-east of Dark Lane, Broseley generally in a south-westerly direction for a length of 178 yards or thereabouts and the public right of way known as Footpath 157 at Broseley aforesaid from its junction with the said Footpath 149 in a generally south-easterly direction for a length of 47 yards or thereabouts to an alternative route.

East Suffolk County Development Plan (Review of Felixstowe Town Map)

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment has considered the proposals for alterations and additions to the East Suffolk County Development Plan (Review of the Felixstowe Town Map) submitted by the Council on 28th April 1970 and relating to land at Felixstowe and part of neighbouring parishes. Based on the information at present before him, the Secretary of State considers that the proposals should be modified as follows:

Modification

No.	Description of Modification	Reason for Modification
1	Trimley by-pass from the Town Map boundary to the junction with the Southern Relief Road, and the Southern Relief Road from that point to Pewit Hill. Delete "R". Insert "TR".	These roads will be designated as Trunk Roads shortly after completion.
2	Insert new principal traffic road from Trimley by-pass (Map Ref. 300357) to northern end of Beatrice Avenue.	This road is at present under construction.
3	Show St. Andrew's Road as a principal traffic road ("R").	To complete the gyratory system in the northern part of the Town Centre.
4	Key to Town Map: Insert: "Trunk Roads—TR" Amend "Principal Roads" to read "Principal Traffic Roads".	To complete and correct the Key.
