CIVIC AMENITIES ACT, 1967

Conservation Area at Gringley-on-the-Hill

Notice is hereby given that the Nottinghamshire County Council as Local Planning Authority, after consultation with the East Retford Rural District Council, have designated the area referred to in the Schedule to this notice as a Conservation Area for the purposes of section 1 of the Civic Amenities Act, 1967. The Conservation Area, which the County Council consider to be an area of special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which should be preserved or enhanced, will be the subject of stringent control of development and the County Council intend to take such action as may be available to them to secure the preservation and general improvement of the area.

The Conservation Area is more particularly defined on the map which may be inspected free of cost during normal working hours at the office of the County Director of Planning, County Hall, West Bridgford, Nottingham, or at the office of the Clerk to the East Retford Rural District Council, Amcott House, 40 Grove Street, Retford, Notts.

SCHEDULE

Gringley-on-the-Hill in the Rural District of East Retford

The Conservation Area boundary begins by including the pinfold situated at the eastern end of

the village on the northern side of the continuation of High Street and enclosing the Roman Camp Site, Beacon Hill, crossing the Beacon Hill Road 70 yards north of the High Street junction and continuing westerly for 200 yards, taking in the plots on the north side of High Street.

The boundary then changes direction north-west for 80 yards then turning south-west for 80 yards joining Horsewells Street on its eastern side and following it north to Fingle Street veering north-east along its southern side for 40 yards, altering direction by travelling north-west for 120 yards to include the property known as "The Homestead".

From this point it moves south-west for 70 yards crossing the north end of Horsewells Street and enclosing the two properties at the Low Street and Horsewells Street junction, drops south-east along the western side of Horsewells Street to a point 60 yards north from its junction with Little Lane, turning south-west to include the properties on the north side of Little Lane as far as Cross Hill.

The boundary now progresses north for 25 yards turning west across Cross Hill and continuing for 60 yards to a point where it changes direction south for 40 yards reaching the south side of Westwell Lane, turning east to the rear boundaries of the properties on the west side of Cross Hill.

The boundary follows the rear boundaries for 90 yards in a southerly direction before turning west for 50 yards and then drops south-east to include the Children's Hospital.

At a point 30 yards west of the Mill Road and Cross Hill junction the boundary crosses Mill Road, going south for 40 yards and follows the rear boundaries of the properties at the east end of Mill Road across to the east side of the continuation of Cross Hill where it runs east, parallel to High Street for 230 yards before turning north for 50 yards and then east again for another 230 yards.

The boundary changes direction northwards for 33 yards to meet the south side of High Street along which it travels east as far as the pinfold at Beacon Hill.

The area enclosed by the boundary will be known as the Gringley-on-the-Hill Conservation Area.
