Berne, July 6. M.c. Whe Commotions in the Cevennes and the Vivariz encrease daily, and the Reformed have lately been joined by great Numbers of the Roman Catholick Persuasion; to that ic at present appears, that these Disturbances arise as well from the general Distatisfaction of the People, as from the Persecution in Point of Religion. Our late Advices concerning an Action between the King's Troops and these Malecontents are confirmed. Letters from Lyons of the thirtieth of the last Month tell us, that there were fixteen hundred Men killed in the Field of Battel, but do not fay whether the King's Forces or the Malecontents had the Victory: What makes us conclude the latter had the Advantage, is, that the Duke of Berwick, upon advice of this Engagement, had detached cleven Barralions to join the Duke of Roquelaure, who was likewife to be reinforced by twenty feven Squadrons from Spain. It is faid, that the Duke of Berwick's Army, after this Detachment, confifted of feven'y Earta-lions and fi ty Squadrons. There are Letters which fay the Malecontents, fince this Action, confilled of a Body of five thousand Men; and that some Swils Regiments not only refused to Charge, but fired upon their own Officers, who urged them to obey their Orders. These Advices add, that the French King had commended all his Troops, except twenty four Battalions, to retire out of Spzin; and that those Troops, as they return into his own Dominions, are to be dispersed to several Paris of the Kingdom, in which the Court is apprehensive of Tumel's. The Army commanded by the Duke of Berwick is still Intrenched near Brançon. The Diet of the thirteen Cantons is to meet at Baden on the eighth Instant, and it is not doubted but the Affair of Tockenbourg will foon be wholly adjusted.

Frankfort, July 11. N. S. Yesterday Count de Zobor, Adjutant-General to his Imperial Majesty, set out trome this Place for the Army in Flanders. Count Rechteren is expected here every moment; and it is supposed that as foon as he hath held a Conference with the Deputies of the Neighbouring Circles, he will return to the Hague.
